Mr. John Simpson, Training Officer and Fundraising Committee Member, Mr. Allan Thomas and Mr. Michael Coyle, Coquitlam Search & Rescue Society, appeared before the Committee outlining SAR's various operations and responsibilities, and seeking assistance to fund the Mobile Command Centre Replacement Project.

It was noted that Coquitlam Search and Rescue (SAR) serves the communities of Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Anmore, Belcarra, Burnaby and New Westminster, and has provided emergency services in both urban and wilderness settings since 1972.

The Society, based at Coquitlam's Town Centre Fire Hall, operates under the provincial Emergency Management BC and performs searches and rescue in an area that is over 1000 km². The team has 54 active members, all volunteers, on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, on a year-round basis. In 2013, the team responded to 38 operations for a total of 3,044 volunteer hours, resulting in the rescue or recovery of 29 persons.

The SAR's current Mobile Command Centre, in which search and rescue activities are planned, implemented and managed, is 20 years old and due for replacement. In addition to providing command centre capability for the next 20 years, a new Mobile Command Centre will provide a more robust vehicle to meet the needs of one of the fastest growing areas of the Lower Mainland. This vehicle will have the capability to travel on more challenging roads with greater fuel efficiency, transport additional field equipment, and enhance search and rescue management capability through new technology and additional floor space for work stations and briefings.

The estimated project budget is \$407,300. Funding in the amount of \$100,000 has been already committed from the CSAR Endowment Fund (\$35,000) and the City of Coquitlam (\$65,000).

MOBILE COMMAND CENTRE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

PURPOSE: To provide information on Coquitlam Search and Rescue Society, and to seek

approval for financial support to replace the Mobile Command Centre

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT the Executive Committee of Council recommend Council approve a grant in the amount of \$35,000 to the Coquitlam Search and Rescue Society for replacement of the Mobile Command Centre

REPORT

The Executive Committee of Council, at its meeting held on 2014 December 04, received a delegation from Coquitlam Search and Rescue Society outlining their various operations and responsibilities, and seeking assistance to fund the Mobile Command Centre Replacement Project (detailed SAR's report on the Mobile Command Centre Replacement Prospectus is available in the Office of the City Clerk).

1.0 BACKGROUND

Coquitlam Search and Rescue (SAR) serves the communities of Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Anmore, Belcarra, Burnaby and New Westminster, and has provided emergency services in both urban and wilderness settings since 1972. The services provided include:

- wilderness search and rescue
- wilderness medical rescue
- swiftwater rescue
- mountain rescue
- rope (high angle and slope) rescue
- avalanche rescue
- inland waters rescue
- missing children and adults with dementia searches

- animal rescue
- disaster assistance
- evacuation due to flooding, earthquake, landslide and interface forest fire
- tracking

2.0 THE TEAM

The team, based at Coquitlam's Town Centre Fire Hall, operates under the provincial Emergency Management BC (EMBC) and performs searches and rescue in an area that is over 1000 km². The team also assists the RCMP detachments in the Lower Mainland jurisdictions.

Coquitlam SAR currently has 54 active members, all volunteers; members are on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, on a year-round basis.

In 2013, the team responded to 38 operations for a total of 3,044 volunteer hours, resulting in the rescue or recovery of 29 persons. Professional emergency service providers, i.e. police, BC Ambulance, the provincial Coroner's Office, and the communities have come to rely upon Coquitlam SAR for the essential services it provides.

3.0 THE MOBILE COMMAND CENTRE

Search and rescue activities are planned, implemented and managed in the Mobile Command Centre (MCC). The MCC allows the team to deploy where needed with the aid of pre-plans, maps, radio and satellite communications, internet access and equipment for the team's full range of technical rescue skills. The MCC activities include all aspects of the provincial Incident Command System.

3.1 CURRENT MOBILE COMMAND CENTRE

The current Command Centre, a Grumman panel truck, has a chassis that is commonly used for delivery of bulky, but light, goods. While adequate for cargo, such as bakery products or parcels, SAR operations require a vehicle which can not only support command centre operations but also transport heavier cargo such as stretchers, ropes, generators, fuel, batteries, rescue equipment and an array of computer equipment.

3.2 NEW MOBILE COMMAND CENTRE

The new Command Centre consists of three major components:

1. Cab & Chassis

A Freightliner M2-106 Extended Cab with a Cummins 6.7L turbo diesel engine or equivalent cab & chassis has been determined to meet the needs of the new MCC and address shortcomings of the current vehicle.

2. Command Centre Module

The heart of the centre, containing the infrastructure and equipment necessary to support the effective management of all phases of a SAR operation. The module includes metal enclosure, desks, cabinets and shelves, wiring, lighting, auxiliary generator air conditioning and space heating systems, etc.

3. Command Centre Technology

This centre is comprised of the electronic technology which directly supports search and rescue management (computer hardware, video monitors and a smart board, printers, software, batteries, communication systems, including radios, cell and satellite phones, and internet connectivity).

4.0 FUNDING

The estimated project budget, including all applicable taxes, is \$407,300. Funding in the amount of \$100,000 has been already committed to the replacement of the Command Centre from CSAR Endowment Fund (\$35,000) and City of Coquitlam (\$65,000).

Funding is also being solicited by the Society from the following sources: Spirit of Coquitlam Grant, BC Gaming Grant, City of Port Moody, City of Port Coquitlam, City of Burnaby, Metro Vancouver and other corporate sponsors.

5.0 SUSTAINABILITY

The projected life span of the new Mobile Command Centre is 20 years, commensurate with the command centre that is to be replaced. The City of Coquitlam will maintain and repair as necessary the Cab and Chassis over the lifespan of the Mobile Centre as an 'in kind' donation, while Coquitlam SAR will maintain, repair and upgrade, as necessary, the Command Centre Technology as part of its operating budget and from future grant applications.

6.0 CONCLUSION

The SAR's current Mobile Command Centre, in which search and rescue activities are planned, implemented and managed, is 20 years old and due for replacement. In addition to providing command centre capability for the next 20 years, a new Mobile Command Centre will provide a more robust vehicle to meet the needs of one of the fastest growing areas of the Lower Mainland, with the capability to travel on more challenging roads and with greater fuel efficiency, transport additional field equipment, and enhance search and rescue management capability through new technology and additional floor space for work stations and briefings. It is recommended that a grant in the amount of \$35,000 be approved to support the Mobile Command Centre Replacement Project.

Re: Application for Community Grant

Please accept our application for a community grant in the amount of \$20,000 for 2015.

Since 1974 Burnaby Family Life (BFL) has relied on the City of Burnaby for finaicial and in-kind donations for its operations. BFL does not take the City's annual assistance for granted. We see your ongoing support as recognition of the leadership role we have taken in building community capacity for the past four decades.

The City's generosity in providing annual lease subsidies, affordable printing of program brochures and an annual community grant demonstrates the City's historical partnership with BFL, its compassion and commitment to provide support to *all* Burnaby citizens – including some of the most disadvantaged families in our community.

In 2014 some of the key challenges facing families in Burnaby continued with the lack of affordable housing, lack of affordable quality childcare, poverty, mental illness and the integration of immigrants and refugees in our city. According to our program participants and stakeholders, BFL has made a significant difference in each of these critical areas, thereby benefitting thousands of people and strengthening our community.

Census reports show that Burnaby is one of the most diverse cities in all of Canada. Approximately 61% of residents speak English as a second language and 51% of citizens are foreign born. We know that in some neighbourhoods almost *all* residents speak English as a second language. Using Statistics Canada's Low Income Measure (LIM) after tax, 20.6% of British Columbia's children ages 0–17 lived below the poverty line, representing more than one in every five children in the province. According to this measure, 169,420 BC children lived in poverty, putting this province fifth highest in comparison to other provinces. It is a shame that BC has the worst poverty rate of any province for children living in single mother families at 49.8%. In response, we advocate pro-actively and relentlessly at every level of government and with influential decision makers for policy changes. BFL is an active participant in provincial lobbying efforts for the social services sector through the BC Federation of Community Social Services, Board Voice and other coalitions.

Collectively, we are doing our best to keep the plight of the vulnerable amongst us front and center in the minds of every member of the provincial legislature. We have garnered significant support from the Burnaby business community for our efforts as evidenced by the strong corporate support of our annual Kids Challenge event as we go into our fourth year.



Burnaby Family Life's multi-faceted partnerships with other community organizations as well as the business sector continued to develop and expand significantly in 2014. BFL continued to play a key role on the BBOT Social Development Committee, particularly in the area of family friendly workplaces. The BBOT opened many doors for us and has done a great job in getting our key messages out to the business community. Burnaby is known throughout the province for promoting corporate social responsibility, for educating and raising awareness about poverty, homelessness, and the value of investing in the social services sector.

Burnaby Family Life is the founding and leading organization for the Burnaby Intercultural Planning Table (BIPT), a dynamic community co-ordination network in which government and community service organizations work together to improve service collaboration and a more effective community based response to families who have moved here from around the world. Through the BIPT, we have brought together more than 30 organizations and managed, on behalf of the consortium, a range of diverse community development projects. This year, the Federal Government has assumed responsibility for the funding envelop and the focus is shifting to the development of a strategic plan aimed at improving the city's ability to meet the changing needs of our community.

BFL continues to work in formal partnerships and sub-contracts with 25+ different community based agencies, as well as the Burnaby Board of Trade. These efforts have resulted in a more effective social safety net for Burnaby families. BFL provides other organizations with mentoring, shares best practice models, assists with policy development, preparation for accreditation and plays a key role in regional, provincial and national advocacy efforts.

BFL maintains remarkable, award winning accreditation standards with CARF and just received another three year accreditation this past June. We received a number of exemplary mentions for excellent financial management, highly effective administrative systems and most importantly the high quality standard which are omnipresent in the delivery of all of our services. A mini "United Nations" in the heart of our community, BFL staff speak 47 different first languages, representing the community we serve. With BFL's commitment to continuous quality improvement processes and accreditation standards, the positive impact of our organization never stagnates.

Many services depend on private donations and grants. In 2013, Pro Organics and CKNW provided 30,000 nutritious snacks, 300 meals and 1250 hot lunches to 300 plus children and pregnant teenagers every day. Every dollar that is donated to BFL is "stretched to the max" with our services extended by 30 volunteers working in professional and para-professional program teams. BFL is able to do more because the City of Burnaby and the School District provide free or subsidized space. The Health Region dedicates community health nurses and dental hygienist to our programs supporting parents, high-risk pre & post natal mothers and vulnerable children.

Thousands of children and families have found comfort, meaning, growth and learning at BFL because of visionary, effective governance combined with committed and highly trained employees who have the expertise to intervene with skills and compassion that really make a difference. Families are strengthened and the quality of life is better in Burnaby because of the exceptional work provided. Services are filled to overflowing and sadly, families are sometimes turned away because we do not have the capacity to meet the increasingly complex and demanding needs of our community.

As indicated in our September 8th, 2014 grant request, we have agreed to a new funding formula with Burnaby Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services. This formula acknowledges the fixed and variable expenses with an annual \$17,000 grant paid early in the year and a supplemental grant at the end of the year of \$4 per approved application.

Based on a projected 2,271 approved applications for this year, and adjusted for a \$176 underpayment last year, we are requesting a supplemental grant of \$9,260.

CHANGE STARTS WITH YOU

Burnaby Community Services is a charitable society providing people in need with a voice, resources, and opportunities. We believe that given the right tools, the necessary support, and access to a team of understanding, innovative, and positive people, every one of us has the ability to make changes in our lives and in our community.

If you are a family that is struggling, a senior without a support network, or are simply trying to move forward, we understand. Since 1971 Burnaby Community Services has provided programs and publications to support you and others in our community.

Since the fall of 1996, Burnaby Community Services has assisted Burnaby Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services by administering income verification services for the Burnaby Recreation Credit program. The Recreation Credit program provides low-income residents with credits that can be used towards any Burnaby Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services' facility for various programs and admissions.

This supplemental request is based on \$4 per approved application. From January 1st to November 30th we have approved 2,029 applications and are projecting 242 additional applications before the end of the year (based on last year's numbers).

Last year we received a grant for 2,352 approved applications, but approved 2,396 applications.

The formula therefore is:
