Ms. Brenda Gershkovitch, Executive Director of Big Sisters of BC Lower Mainland,

appeared before the Committee providing an overview of programs offered by the organization.

The speaker noted that the Big Sisters offer three programs to the girls aged 7 to 17:

- 1. One-to-one Program (adult mentoring a child)
- 2. Study Buddy (one-to-one academic mentorship)
- 3. Go Girls (healthy lifestyles for girls aged 10 14)

Over the past four years the Big Sisters served the girls in Metro Vancouver (with 20% in Burnaby) as follows:

2012 - 623 girls

2013 - 695 girls

2014 - 767 girls

2015 – 819 girls

Ms. Gershkovitch advised that the girls are paired with volunteers based on character, desires and goals (never on ethnicity or religion), and this cross-culture experience has been very rewarding.

The speaker noted the organization has 23 employees, and many dedicated volunteers who are highly trained, screened and supervised.

In conclusion, Ms. Gershkovitch thanked the City of Burnaby for their support over the years.

SUBJECT: BANNING SMOKING AND VAPOUR SMOKING IN PUBLIC SPACES

At the Executive Committee meeting on 2016 September 21, the Committee received a correspondence from the Canadian Cancer Society requesting Council support to ban smoking including electronic smoking devices in restaurants and bar patios, outdoor public spaces, parks, beaches, trails and playgrounds. Arising from the discussion, the Committee requested staff to provide a memo on the City's current no-smoking policy in comparison to other municipalities in the Lower Mainland and provide comments on whether the initiative identified in the noted correspondence is supportable.

Staff has completed a review of the no-smoking policy in other municipalities in the Lower Mainland and note that the restrictions with respect to smoking in public places continue to vary amongst communities (see <u>Attachment #1</u>). With regards to vapour smoking, five communities in the Lower Mainland (City of Vancouver, City of Coquitlam, City of North Vancouver, Corporation of Delta and City of Maple Ridge) have included vapour smoking into their smoking bylaw.

It is to be noted that the City did have a Smoking Regulation Bylaw which was enforced by the Fraser Health Authority on behalf of the City. However, given that banning of smoking in public spaces arises as a Provincial function and that the Provincial Tobacco and Vapour Control Product Act includes restrictive measures for both cigarettes and more recently vapour smoking in public spaces, the City repealed its smoking bylaw in 2013. Fraser Health staff now continues to enforce the provisions of the Provincial Tobacco and Vapour Control Act in Burnaby. With respect to the vapour smoking restrictions in Burnaby, staff spoke to the Fraser Health official and was informed that their staff are presently educating the retail operators regarding the requirements related to vapour smoking. This will be followed up with progressive enforcement both at the retail level and where complaints are received regarding vapour smoking in public spaces.

Of particular note is the festival's focus on zero waste. Since 2014 the society has made a concentrated effort to make the European Festival a zero waste event. All food is now served on compostable plates with compostable cutlery and cups. Other recyclable materials including the cooking oil from the vendors are collected separately. In both 2015 and 2016 they received a certificate of recognition for achieving a 95% diversion rate for this initiative. Additionally, the money collected from returnable cans and bottles is now being donated to local charities.
