

The Italian Chamber of Commerce has had professional and business relation with the Padova Chamber of Commerce for a long time and we shall be pleased to recommend to our counterpart the positive aspects of a linkage with Burnaby not only on an economic side, but also on a cultural, educational and tourism side. For your information, here are a few quick facts that may convince you on why Padova would be an excellent choice for engaging in a sister city relationship.

The Padova Region is a highly developed industrial zone in northeast Italy. There regional economy is vibrant and thriving, with thousands of large and small and medium-sized enterprises of every kind which would present many opportunities for business arrangements and possibly partnerships for Burnaby businesses. Transportation in the area is among the best with motorways, 2 railway stations, river ways and airport. Padova is one of 3 cities that form a Metropolitan HUB of 2.5 million people. The other 2 cities of this HUB, Venice and Treviso, are both within an hour's drive or some 30 minutes by train. The median income of this HUB is among the highest in Italy and the European Union allowing for a fairly high standard of living.

Both Canada and Italy are parties to the Canada-EU Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement ("CETA ") which took effect in September, 2017. Beyond removal of 98% of tariffs on goods traded between Canada and the EU, and of course, Italy as an EU member state, CETA also eliminates non-tariff barriers that impede the flow of capital, investment, intellectual property, technological know-how and personnel presenting opportunities for many entrepreneurs and businesses in Burnaby to penetrate the EU market. The EU is, collectively, the world's largest economy. It is also Canada's second largest trading partner. CETA facilitates access for Canadian businesses to a prosperous market of more than 440 million inhabitants. It will offer Burnaby businesses significant opportunities to diversify their export sales and services thus reducing their dependency on other markets that have recently exhibited volatility and uncertainty. A strong institutional, business and cultural relationship between Padova and Burnaby will enhance the ability of Burnaby's citizens and business community to penetrate the EU market through Padova as a gateway.

Padua is also known for having the second oldest university in Europe dating back to 1222. It has one of the most advanced schools of medicine in the country with the oldest and most famous medical teaching theatre in the world. Please accept this letter in support of the proposal to explore a sister city relationship with the City of Padua, Italy.

Simon Fraser University has a strong commitment to global engagement and a long history of collaboration with Italy across a broad range of activities including research collaboration, student exchanges, and field schools. This also includes formal agreements with a number of Italian institutions with two new partnerships being pursued currently.

While there is no formal agreement with the University of Padua, SFU and the University of Padua have established research connections most notably in psychology but also in biomedical engineering, molecular neurobiology and cognitive science. Additionally, Padua has strengths in areas complementary to SFU such as microbiology, genome science, earth science and physics. These complementarities could be explored as potential areas of new research collaborations.

The University of Padua is also well structured to support student mobility partnerships and SFU would be interested in exploring opportunities for student exchange or other forms of student mobility. The University of Padua is one of the oldest universities in Europe with a long tradition of student mobility across Europe and globally.
