Dura is located 8 km southwest of Hebron / West Bank and is the center of more than 43 villages and rural communities and it is considered to be the second largest area in the west bank area is 145000 dunums.

Is characterized by the role of many organizations, institutions and associations that provide services to the population and aims to improve their social, economic and environmental status ... etc. Dura municipality is one of those organizations that seek to help citizens in their lives.

The population of the city of Dura and its villages is about 105 thousand people in the total gatherings and about 41 thousand for the city of Dura (center) according to the Palestinian census 2017.

Dura Municipality was established in 1967 and has continuous ambitions to serve all members of society (children, women, the elderly, youth and handicaps), for example, it provides water, electricity, paved roads, garden, playground ... etc. He also does not rule out people with special needs from his program. He established the first center in the West Bank for these marginalized groups to serve and integrate them into society.

The municipality seeks to exchange experiences with similar municipalities in serving the population in this context, we hope to be in touch with a number of friendly municipalities in which we can share experiences in the field of joint work.

We would be happy if you agreed to build a relationship or partnership with our city Or participate in supporting our projects and all the hope of waiting for your response with all happiness





Note from Clerks Office:

Report from International Relations and Friendhsip Cities Committee appears on the Council Agenda for 2019 April 08.

As the board of trade in one of the most diverse communities in the country, we understand the importance and value of fostering and strengthening international relationships, and encourage the City of Burnaby to establish such a relationship with the City of Padua, Italy.

Over the years, the Burnaby Board of Trade has hosted international delegations from and participated in visits to Burnaby's sister and friendship cities including Kushiro, Japan, Hwaseong, Korea and Zhongshan, China. The benefits of developing these types of relationships is a deepening of cultural understanding and the creation of potential economic collaboration. I can personally attest to the value of these types of relationships in facilitating trade and business activity.

To date, much focus has been on building relationships in Asia. However, we were excited to learn that the City of Padua in Italy has indicated an interest in starting a dialogue toward an eventual sister city relationship with the City of Burnaby. The settlement of the Italian community in all parts of the country, including Burnaby, has profoundly impacted the Canadian cultural and business landscape. In fact, we are proud to share that Milani Plumbing, Drainage and Heating, the 2018 Burnaby Business Hall of Fame inductee, chose to make Burnaby its home many decades ago when the founder immigrated to our community from Italy.

Like Padua, the City of Burnaby has grown to be a significant and diverse hub for businesses in the life sciences, technology, and innovation sectors. In addition, Burnaby and Padua both have strong post-secondary education sectors in our respective cities.

The Burnaby Board of Trade encourages the City of Burnaby to pursue a sister city agreement with the City of Padua, and I would be delighted to discuss this further and explore any ways the Burnaby Board of Trade could be of assistance.
