'Thank you for your continued commitment.

For any of you who attended the Burnaby Board of Trade luncheon a few weeks ago for the State of the City address, you will already know that housing was a key part of the remarks I delivered there. Housing affects the entire city.

Through the work of this Task Force and *Your Voice. Your Home.* The public engagement process, we are making progress in finding ways to build more affordable community housing to serve the needs of the people of Burnaby.

Today, we begin the next step in the process. Michelle Bested from SFU will get that underway shortly.

On May 25<sup>th</sup>, a select group of Burnaby residents will undertake a full-day workshop to identify some pathways to resolving our housing crisis. Task Force members are invited to join me in the afternoon of May 25th when we will receive the recommendations from residents at the public workshop.

In preparation for this dialogue, SFU has developed a discussion guide that outlines information and approaches for addressing housing. The discussion guide will give residents housing information and introduce some ideas to help get the dialogue underway. I also would like to thank the staff for their incredible work in helping us prepare this report, and the SFU Centre for Dialogue staff for their professionalism and assistance.

Before I turn the meeting over to Michelle, I would like to recognize how much work each of you have done in a very short time to get us to this point.

I'm looking forward to a collaborative and constructive conversation tonight.'

Ms. Michelle Bested, presented an overview of the public engagement activities for Phase Two of Your Voice. Your Home. These activities will include a Discussion Guide, Community Recommendations Workshop on 2019 May 25, and a Community Quick Starts Survey.

The *Discussion Guide* will provide participants of the *Community Recommendations Workshop* with an overview of the City's current housing context and an introduction to housing approaches and perspectives. The Guide will assist workshop and *Quick Starts Community Survey* participants in preparation for informed dialogue, the ability to evaluate trade-offs and ultimately create a series of recommendations to guide the Task Force and Council on actions for community and affordable housing.

The Community Recommendations Workshop will take place on 2019 May 25, with 126 community members who were chosen to reflect the City's diverse backgrounds and housing interests. Participants of the workshop will be evaluating housing options and creating recommendations to guide the Task Force and Council.

The Quick Starts Community Survey is the final community engagement component for Phase Two. The survey will collect general demographic information, identify the top three Quick Starts and garner feedback on housing approaches contained within the Discussion Guide.

The activities in Phase Two of *Your Voice. Your Home.* will build on the ideas from Phase One and assist the Mayor's Task Force On Community Housing with recommendations for the final report.
