An application request for \$3,000 has been received from the Chinese Taoism Kuan Kung Association for the 2016 Tian Jin Festival 2016 May 07-08 at 3426 Smith Avenue in Burnaby. This free family oriented event will promote an understanding of Chinese and Taoism arts and culture through stage performances, exhibits, interactive activities and food.

The Chinese Taoism Kuan Kung Association, founded in 1995, is a charitable organization, run completely by volunteers. In 2012 the Tian Jin Temple opened in Burnaby to share and increase awareness of Chinese and Taoist culture.

The application has been completed in full and the applicant has shown evidence that they have the capacity to coordinate the event. Festivals Burnaby funds would be allocated toward eligible project expenses related to programming, marketing/promotions and administration.
