SUBJECT: **BURNABY BIG BEND FARM TOUR**

At its meeting of 2016 September 13, the Environment Committee received an update regarding the development of a self-guided farm tour brochure of market gardens in the Big Bend area. This memo provides further updates regarding the Tour.

The first edition of the Tour brochure included nine market garden, nursery or farm locations in the Big Bend including several in the Willard Street/Meadow Avenue area. The Tour brochure has been updated (attached) and now includes eight locations due to one of the farms previously listed having moved outside of the region. The original locations were selected based on their willingness to participate and whether the operation in question had some public facing element (e.g. market store) for visitors. Suggestions for additional locations have not been received to date. Staff will follow up on any suggestions for additional locations as they are received. The Tour brochure is available online on the City's website (under the 'Food Security' child page), on the Burnaby Food First blog (burnabyfoodfirst.blogspot.ca), and the Tourism Burnaby webpage (www.tourismburnaby.com).

In addition to the Tour brochure, a new interactive online map of the Tour has been developed and is now available on the City's website (under the 'Maps and Open Data' child page). The online map is mobile-friendly and enables users to zoom in on the map to assist with navigation to and from the area as well as between locations on the map. The online map also includes brief descriptions about each of the locations and a link to their websites, if one is available. Both Burnaby Food First and Tourism Burnaby have been requested to add a link to the online map on their websites.


