- **PURPOSE:** To request approval of the expenditure from the 2017-2021 Annual Financial Plan for four projects and to request Council to bring forward a Capital Reserves Bylaw to finance these projects.

The 2017-2021 Annual Financial Plan for Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services contain the following four projects to be funded from Capital Reserves. To enable work to go ahead on these projects, approval is requested to bring down a bylaw for funding.

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# 3. Riverway Restaurant

DPY.0049 \$200,000

Replacement of the commercial fridge and addition of a new walk In freezer to increase capacity for large events and to store food items purchased at off peak time for use in the busy season, millwork improvements (lobby wood paneling and photo wall paneling) to provide an improved atmosphere for attracting wedding functions, replacement and/or purchase of new minor equipment to include; tables (old ones to be used at alternate locations), storage room shelving to keep up with the increase volume of supplies required, patio umbrella replacement that are properly suited to our weather conditions, storage unit for outside wedding chairs to reduce labour costs for set ups, bench replacement to include glass wind blockers for weather protection which will increase patio customer capacity and a new retractable awning to enable an outdoor barbeque area for more customer service.

## 4. Food Services Equipment

DPY.0054 \$100,000

New Cappuccino machine for Encore's Bistro, "Rational" oven for Ice Cream Parlour, and various minor equipment replacement.

Sufficient Capital Reserves are available to complete the above projects in the 2017-2021 Annual Financial Plan. It is recommended that Council be requested to bring down a bylaw to appropriate \$533,832 (inclusive of GST) from Capital Reserves to finance these projects.
