Dear Kathryn Matts and Commission members,

I am writing on behalf of the Cameron Elementary Parent Advisory Council (PAC), to submit our application for a City of Burnaby Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission grant to fund the purchase of an accessible swing for Cameron's playground.

Cameron Elementary has 43 students with special needs, three of whom have significant mobility needs. Additionally, another five students have sensory needs that this swing would benefit. Most playground equipment isn't built with these children in mind, and indeed Cameron's playground is less accessible than we might like. We would like to purchase an "Oodle Swing," which has a larger saucer-shaped seat, providing more stability for children with balance or motor issues (see Appendix A). Ideally this swing would be installed adjacent to the existing swings at Cameron (see Appendix B), in order to encourage interaction and shared play among children of all abilities.

The cost of the Oodle Swing from Habitat Systems is approximately \$7200 (totaling approximately \$8100 after taxes). The Cameron PAC has received a grant of \$2500 from the Canada Post Community Foundation for the purchase of this swing (see Appendix C). Additionally, the PAC has raised over \$1600 towards this purchase, totalling a PAC contribution of at least \$4100 which is already in place. We would like to request a Playground Development Grant of \$4000 to match our funds and help purchase this important piece of inclusive playground equipment. The Cameron PAC has not requested this grant within the past four years.

Cameron's playground is accessible to the public outside of school hours—and ours is a dense neighbourhood populated primarily by high rises, so the playground is heavily used by the community. We do acknowledge that there is a similar saucer swing at Cameron Park, two blocks from the school, and we welcome the City's input on the installation of one at Cameron Elementary as well. However, we feel that it can only be beneficial to increase the number of accessible play options in our neighbourhood, and to ensure that there is an accessible feature on our playground for children to use during school. We have the support of school administration and staff for the addition of the Oodle swing to Cameron's playground. Installation of this swing is supported by the Burnaby School District (see Appendix D).


