District 1 Report

- A District 1 CPAC member and of the Burnaby Citizens Crime Watch volunteer reported that Citizens Crime Watch has grown to 16 members.
- Residents are pleased to see pedestrian operated traffic lights along Willingdon Avenue in conjunction with
 the new Willingdon Linear Park. This will make crossing Willingdon safer for pedestrians including the many
 École Alpha Secondary School who cross every day. There have been numerous serious auto collisions
 involving pedestrians including the 2010 fatal hit-and-run of 73 year old Virginia Itubay who was in the
 cross-walk on Willingdon at Kitchener when hit by a driver who then drove off.
- Prior to full implementation of the new traffic signals on Willingdon Avenue in the vicinity of the Willingdon
 Linear Park the lights were operated on flashing yellow lights for several days. Apparently drivers have
 forgotten how to proceed on flashing amber and drivers variously came to a full stop and did not move
 while others accelerated to speed through the flashing amber lights. For drivers turning onto Willingdon
 Avenue from a side street, it was too dangerous to enter onto Willingdon with the unpredictable manner of
 how drivers on Willingdon Avenue reacted to the flashing yellow lights.

Suggest in future simply going to full operation to avoid introducing unneeded confusion. Drivers frequenting a street with newly install signals will see the dark signals covered in burlap. When the signal lights eventually become operational it will not be a surprise to drivers.

- Drivers are similarly unaware of how to proceed through traffic round-abouts and who has the right-of-way. Perhaps the issue warrants periodic information campaigns and reminders or use a set of temporary informational signs that can be erected at key locations, installed for some days then moved to another key location.
- Merchants along Hastings Street observed that during rush hour that drivers have taken to speeding down the alleys adjacent and parallel to Hastings Street to beat the traffic on Hastings Street. CPAC has suggested to the merchants to consider requesting speed bumps.
- The District 1 Community Police Offices will achieve its 20 anniversary in 2019. There are opportunities for public engagement. Suggest that during events such as Hats Off Day and Hallowe'en that in conjunction with handing out stickers or candy that the CPO take the opportunity to engage the public in promoting community policing and describing volunteer opportunities.
