BYLAW NO. 13918

A BYLAW to amend the Zoning
Bylaw provisions to various sections

The Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as **BURNABY ZONING BYLAW 1965, AMENDMENT BYLAW NO. 30, 2018.**
2. Burnaby Zoning Bylaw 1965, as amended, is further amended:
 - (a) at Section 309.2, by adding after subsection (17) the following:
“(18) Fitness and health facilities.”
 - (b) at subsections 601.1, (6) and 602.1 (4), by deleting the word “bees”;
 - (c) at Section 601.1, by adding after subsection (12) the following:
“(13) The keeping of bees, provided that all hives or structures used for such purposes are:
 - (a) surrounded by a solid fence or hedge not less than 1.8m (5.91ft.) in height; or
 - (b) set back not less than 7.5m (25 ft.) from all lot lines; or
 - (c) elevated not less than 2.5m (8.0ft.) above the surface of the ground.”
 - (d) at Section 602.1, by adding after subsection (6) the following:
“(7) The keeping of bees, provided that all hives or structures used for such purposes are:
 - (a) surrounded by a solid fence or hedge not less than 1.8m (5.91ft.) in height; or

- (b) set back not less than 7.5m (25 ft.) from all lot lines; or
- (c) elevated not less than 2.5m (8.0ft.) above the surface of the ground,

except that on lots with an area less than 2,000m² (0.2 ha), not more than two beehives and two nucleus colonies shall be maintained on the lot, and all hives or structures used for such purposes shall be located in the rear yard.”

- (e) at Section 603.1, by repealing subsection (3) and replacing it with the following:

“(3) The keeping of bees, provided that all hives or structures used for such purposes are:

- (a) surrounded by a solid fence or hedge not less than 1.8m (5.91ft.) in height; or
- (b) set back not less than 7.5m (25 ft.) from all lot lines; or
- (c) elevated not less than 2.5m (8.0ft.) above the surface of the ground.”
