REPORTS

General

- Willingdon Linear Park had its opening in July. Good reception by community.
- RCMP reports that there are four full-time bike patrol RCMP members who will begin at the end
 of November. They will work in full uniform. Two will serve on the north side, and two on the
 south side.
- RCMP reports that Break and Enters and Theft from Autos have been trending down recently.
- RCMP reports that 14 new members have been approved for Burnaby. They will arrive over the coming 18 months. 8 will be in the first group to arrive; 6 will be in the second group.
- Sue: News items of note include one that a police officer and a bus have collided recently, and that ICBC used an optical-illusion road decal of a child chasing a ball across the street, on Delta Avenue near Brentwood Park Elementary, to excellent effect with the public.

Hallowe'en Candy

- Erin is requesting approval to spend \$300 in CPAC funds for Hallowe'en Candy for Oct. 31, 2018 trick-or-treating on the Heights.
- Some discussion on how to promote CPAC and its role in the community on Oct. 31. We need a personable representative at the front door. Somebody in uniform would be ideal.
- MOTION CPAC moved to allow Erin to have \$300 to spend on Hallowe'en candy.

Hallowe'en Safety

- Isabel of the HMA informed the group that she has asked the RCMP for speed controls along Hastings Street due to the masses of children and parents visiting. Vehicles exceed speed limit.
- The RCMP informed Isabel that such requests need to go through Dawn Dickinson at the main detachment, through a formal process.
- Isabel has also asked the City of Burnaby for a lane closure for two hours on that day. Her first request earlier in the summer was declined, with traffic congestion cited. After receiving more concerned queries from parents, she has asked a second time and is awaiting a response.

CPAC Expenditures

CPAC has spent \$171.23 thus far this fiscal year. Most of it on treats for meetings. Committee
had mixed opinions on whether to buy treats for meeting. General feeling was to leave as is.
Discussion around whether to spend some funds on a day course for our group to educate us?
Suggestion made to bring in a speaker to talk to everyone at once, rather than paying for
everyone to take individual courses. Committee in agreement.

BUZZ AROUND THE TABLE

Chloe / Confederation Park Elementary School: Summer 2018 had fewer problems with partying teenagers than in past years. However, there is considerable refuse found at the school such as used needles, feces, underwear, found. School Board, City of Burnaby and Parks, Culture & Recreation each did not want to deal with it. Cpl. Phil said there is a new RCMP phone number the public can call if no one will help. They will come help. It is not the police's job, however.

The night of Sept. 26, the RCMP was called to the school due to teenagers/youths in supposedly consensual violent fighting, which was being (supposedly also consensually) recorded for posting up on YouTube afterwards. The youths were confrontational and uttered threats of violence to someone who tried to stop them. They disbanded soon afterwards and no one was present when the RCMP arrived.

Alen / Alpha Secondary: Commented on Chloe's contribution that currently, there does seem to be activity among high schoolers to video-record physical fights and post it online to be viewed and commented on by other high schoolers. At Alpha, Alen notes that there are no major problems at his school to his knowledge. Alen noted that Alpha School's renovations are appreciated by the students.

Dave / Crime Stoppers: In July and August, there were 3 files. Susan Salarni (leader) has stepped down. New leader is Patrick Tracy. There is a new directive to be more visible in the neighbourhood. They will wear jackets and engage in public relations. Among their duties are to look for vehicles that belong to people who have a restraining order on their spouse being where they should not be, and report that vehicle to the RCMP.

Isabel / Heights Merchants Association: Conducted a graffiti inventory this month. Sent findings to the City. Used needles is about 1 to 2 per week. Cpl. Phil explained that drug use has not necessarily increased, but that the drug-delivery method has changed; before, drug users used to smoke their drugs. Now, they are injecting them more because hypodermics are cheaper, faster, provide a "better" and "longer-lasting" high.

Andres / Kitchener resident: Often, teenagers are smoking at the school. But otherwise, it is pretty quiet in the neighbourhood. He works at SFU and there are many problems there.

Vernon / Brentwood Park Elementary: Parents mentioned to Principal of the drug use occurring under the alcove of Brentwood Park Elementary.

Don / Brentwood Park Alliance Church and Resident: Nothing to report. The first summer of no vandalism at Brentwood Park School. The lighting seems to have helped. Kids playing up there instead.

Sue / Brentwood Resident: Grade 7 kids irresponsibly cutting in front of traffic in the middle of Midlawn (residential side street). Occurred twice. Also reported on bags of asbestos being dumped on a street in her area. Isabel noted that the same happened on her block in the Heights several weeks ago. RCMP notes it is apparently a somewhat common occurrence in the region. Sue also noted she keeps receiving scam phone calls from a female Chinese-speaking caller.
