## **Community Policing Report District 3**

## Summary report for September and October, 2018.

We were honored to have the presence of OIC, Chief Superintendent Deanne Burleigh at our September meeting.

Members were concerned about the what CPAC should focus at the events, like Canada Day, Festival of Lights at the Edmonds Community Centre. It was suggested to concentrate on safety and security of the target audience, especially the new immigrants. The topics of discussion included:

- Fraud or fraudulent phone calls
- DE stigmatization of Police especially with the younger audiences
- Home owner security- secure the garage doors and the garage door openers.
- The home address on the insurance documents (copy) should be whited out, in case the vehicle is broken. Do not leave the garage door openers in the car.

CPAC 3 has a temporary CPO coordinator, Karina Jensen is replacing Warner Yang who is at the Detachment till the end of the year.

Oct is the second meeting with our new starting time of 7pm. Working members came with ease to the meeting and so we will keep this as our starting time.

CPAC 3 is participating in the Remembrance Day event at George Derby. There is no parade but the students cover the path way with Canadian flags which really attracts the audience.

At the Festival of Lights on November 24 at the Edmonds Community Centre, it was proposed that a focus for this year's event could be cyber security and awareness, including but not limited to: Financial/email fraud/scams, Red flags to watch for in terms of files and websites, and various antivirus and antimalware software. To bring this awareness to the audience, we are hoping to concentrate on projecting real-time show, cyber threats and suspicious websites, etc.

A member is still concerned about the behaviour of the youth (12 -16), who are consistently vandalizing the properties around the Hillside Garden Area.

We are trying to recruit new members, especially youth from the schools, from the Tommy Douglas Library and possibly from Transit police. We would like a standardized poster for recruitment.

A couple of members will be attending the BCCPA one day training on November 7 – "Responding to the Worst, Preparing for the Future".
