

Community Policing summary report for District 1- March/April 2019.

Coffee with the Cops has been a great success. Another is planned for May 16th from 1-3 at Whole Foods at the Solo. It is a good chance for the public to meet with officers in a casual setting. The last two were MacDonalds on Hastings and Starbucks at SFU...very well received.

Mailbox thefts along the Lougheed and Dawson corridors from Gilmore to Willingdon is down. Also B&Es from residences is below the 3 year average and theft from autos is down 16%.

Crime watch has new night patrols-doing very well. They recovered a stolen vehicle with occupants still in it, who were arrested and charged with car theft. Day shift volunteers ran over 2400 plates throughout Burnaby. This past month they have been patrolling Muslim-Islamic centres.
