#### D. PURPOSE OR BENEFIT

1. Describe the purpose or goal of the project/event/program.

The goal of this event is to build community through the arts. Antiapated attendance is 500 people.

2. Describe the project/event/program, and the activities.

Local Burnaby artists will be displaying their artworks at venues along Hastings Street from 11 am – 4 pm on September 28th. This project will allow the public to view, purchase and enjoy local artwork created for the community. Local artists will be present at partnering venues/merchants storefronts to display their artwork and answer any questions that the public may have. It is the hope that this relationship building between the public, the venues and the artists will encourage community building in the Heights area and develop an appreciation for local art.

An all artists gallery will also be included in this crawl with two to three pieces of artwork from each artist housed at the BNH North House during the crawl. The public can view the artwork, receive a map of the event and will be directed to the venues where their favorite artists will be present.

3. Describe how the project/event/program fits into the chosen grant category.

This project fits into the category of a "General Grant" because it is being developed in partnership by Burnaby Non-Profit societies.

4. Describe how this project/event/program will benefit residents of Burnaby (who will benefit). How many Burnaby residents will be involved with or benefit from the project?

4. The funds we are applying for will allow us to offer a unique attraction to Burnaby — an art exhibition that everyone is able to enjoy. Economics will not play a role in determining whether individuals can attend, as one of the big draws of this event is that it is a no-cost activity. It is often a struggle for Burnaby residents to find local events that work for those on a limited income. This event is open to families, seniors and youth including those on a fixed income. Based on past projects such as the Living Room Art in The Heights, we expect at least 500 individuals to attend.

5. Describe how the project/event/program aligns with one or more of the following (Social Sustainability Plan, Environmental Sustainability Plan, Official Community Plan):

5. This events is inline with the City of Burnaby's Social Sustainability vision, goals of inclusion, livability and resilience and strategic priority celebrating diversity and inclusion. The impact of an event such as an Art Crawl is that it will bring art to the forefront of an area, create a vibrant, thriving economy, neighbourhoods are livelier, communities are revitalized, and tourists and residents become attracted to the area. Our goal is that through art we will create a more connected community, where individuals of different backgrounds share a common experience, learn new perspectives and understand one another better. We also expect relationship building to take place between the artists and the merchants, creating more opportunity for art displays in the local businesses. The Heights Neighbourhood Association is excited to be a part of the inaugural Burnaby Art Crawl which will highlight and better reflect the diverse cultural interests of our Burnaby neighbourhood.

Each venue will be tallying the number of visitors to the Art Crawl and we will be surveying the artists to determine whether relationship building took place with the venues and the public.

We have a short survey for the artists and venues to determine the likelihood that they will participate in future Art Crawls. We ask for a rating of public engagement and their overall satisfaction with the event. The success of this event will be based on numbers of participants and artist/venue feedback.
