1. CALL TO ORDER

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley recognized the ancestral and unceded homelands of the handaminam and Skwxwú7mesh speaking peoples, and extended appreciation for the opportunity to hold a meeting on this shared territory.

2. REPORTS

2.1 <u>Financial Management Committee - Re: 2020 March Engineering Capital Infrastructure Bylaw Funding Request - Environmental Rehabilitation Creeks & Culverts</u>

The Financial Management Committee submitted a report seeking Council authorization for a Capital Reserve Fund Bylaw to finance the construction of environmental rehabilitation projects related to culverts, creeks and slopes.

The Financial Management Committee recommended:

1. THAT Council authorize the City Solicitor to bring forward a Capital Reserves Fund Bylaw in the amount of \$1,000,000 to finance the Engineering capital infrastructure improvement project, as outlined in the report.

3.1 <u>AMENDMENT TO BYLAW NOTICE ENFORCEMENT BYLAW (PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION 22 OF PARKS REGULATION BYLAW)</u>

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services seeking Council authorization to bring forward a bylaw to amend the Bylaw Notice Enforcement Bylaw to impose a penalty for non-compliance of Section 22 of the Parks Regulation Bylaw.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT Council authorize the City Solicitor to bring forward a bylaw to amend the Bylaw Notice Enforcement Bylaw to impose a penalty for violation of Section 22 of the Parks Regulation Bylaw.

3.2 PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ROUTINE TRANSACTION BYLAW TO TEMPORARILY INCREASE CITY MANAGER'S SPENDING LIMIT

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance seeking Council authorization to bring forward an amendment to the Routine Transaction Authority Bylaw to temporarily increase the City's Manager's spending limit.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council authorize an increase to the City Manager's authority to approve an award of contract and execute legal agreements for procurement of municipal goods, services and construction where the authorized level does not exceed \$1,000,000, for a period of six months.
- 2. THAT Council authorize the City Solicitor to prepare a bylaw amendment to the Burnaby Routine Transaction Authority Bylaw 1999 to implement the proposed temporary spending limit increase.
