1. CALL TO ORDER

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley, called the Open Council meeting to order at 4:13 p.m. and concluded the roll call.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, members of Council, with the exception of the Chair, Mayor Mike Hurley, and Councillors Calendino, Dhaliwal, Keithley and Wang, participated by electronic means. For the benefit of the Council members that

participated electronically, Mayor Mike Hurley reviewed staff members present at the meeting.

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley, recognized the ancestral and unceded homelands of the həndəminəm and Skwxwú7mesh speaking peoples, and extended appreciation for the opportunity to hold a meeting on this shared territory.

Nova Scotia Mass Shooting

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley, referred to the recent mass shooting in Nova Scotia that resulted in 18 people killed, including a member of the RCMP, and asked Council and staff to observe a minute of silence to honour the victims. On behalf of the City, Mayor Hurley conveyed condolences to families and friends of the victims, the RCMP and to the many communities in Nova Scotia effected by the actions of gunman, Gabriel Wortman.

Correspondence was received from Ms. Elan Gibson, spokesperson for BROKE, expressing concerns with the health and safety infractions from continued construction of the Trans Mountain Expansion on Burnaby Mountain.

A note on the correspondence from the Director Corporate Services advised Council that staff have inquired, and have been provided with, protocols from

TMC regarding distancing and other measures being undertaken on their site. Staff will reach out to the writers and inform them accordingly including approaching CER for observed non-compliance matters.

5. MANAGER'S REPORTS

5.1 BURNABY FIRE DEPARTMENT NEEDS ASSESSMENT

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Public Safety and Community Services providing Council with information regarding a needs assessment that was undertaken on the Burnaby Fire Department.

5.2 COMMERCIAL RENT RELIEF FOR SPORTS/COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services seeking Council authorization to provide rent relief for the community/sports organizations leasing or renting City facilities during the months City facilities are closed.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council authorize temporary rent relief for the four sports and community organizations identified in the report that lease or rent City facilities that are currently closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. THAT this rent relief be extended for six months or until City facilities re-open, whichever is sooner.
- 3. THAT a copy of the report be sent to the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission.

5.3 GRANT TO SUPPORT TEMPORARY BURNABY RENT BANK

1. THAT Council approve a grant of \$30,000 from Operating Contingency funds for the Lower Mainland Purpose Society to operate a temporary rent bank for Burnaby renters.
