Councillor Johnston submitted a Notice of Motion regarding a temporary reduction of the monthly stipend of Council, and requested Council consider waiving notice on the motion.

WHEREAS the World Health Organization has proclaimed a world pandemic known as COVID-19 or coronavirus which is impacting the respiratory health and economies of most nations worldwide; and

WHEREAS Canadian and British Columbian Public Health officials have issued orders requiring citizens and employers to practice social distancing in the workplace and/or to restrict operations to those services essential to permit citizens to stay home and practice social distancing; and

WHEREAS the reduction of services mandated by these Federal and Provincial orders have resulted in the closure of most City of Burnaby services, most notably, City Hall, recreation centres, arenas, swimming pools, golf courses and libraries; and

WHEREAS these closures have resulted in unprecedented monthly revenue reductions to the City exceeding 5.0 million per month in lost services and fees; and

WHEREAS senior governments and Public Health officials are unable to offer a reliable date certain as to when the City can expect to return its service levels to a normal level; and

WHEREAS arising from this unprecedented loss, the City of Burnaby has notified 1,523 employees of the City, who are members of the Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 23, that they are subject to layoff as of May 26, 2020 unless operations are permitted to return to normal; and

WHEREAS as a municipal government, the City of Burnaby is currently ineligible for Federal assistance programs to maintain workers thereby resulting in affected employees having to apply for Employment Insurance or the Canada Emergency Response Benefit program resulting in a loss in income to the affected individuals; and

WHEREAS private sector and NGO employers are eligible to receive subsidies whereby they can retain their employees and fully pay them;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Burnaby Council hereby votes to temporarily reduce its monthly stipend by ten percent in solidarity with our employees affected by this unprecedented world event; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this reduction become effective on May 26, 2020 and last for the period of affected layoffs ending on the date of recall for the majority of affected employees.

#### **His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley - BC Achievement Community Award**

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley, announced that Gloria Kravac, Burnaby resident, is one of 25 outstanding British Columbians who are being celebrated for their contributions in building better, stronger and more resilient communities. At 91 years, Gloria inspires seniors to connect with others and enjoy life as a Citizen Support Services volunteer. Gloria has a long-lasting history of volunteering in Burnaby. She served as the first Chair of the Voices of Burnaby Seniors Task Force, and later as Co-Chair of its Seniors Transportation Committee. Gloria's past service also includes serving on the Better at Home Advisory Committee and Dementia Friendly Communities for the City of Burnaby. Mayor Hurley, on behalf of Council, congratulated Ms. Kravac on receiving the BC Achievement Community Award, and thanked her for her outstanding dedication and service to the community.

### **His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley - Montreal Request for Transit Funding**

His Worship, Mayor Mike Hurley, advised that he received correspondence from the City of Montreal requesting the City of Burnaby consider supporting a declaration to the Government of Canada to provide urgent funding to assure the viability of public transit during the COVID-19 pandemic, and to aid transit operators rebuild ridership. Arising from discussion the following motion was introduced:

WHEREAS the situation of an unprecedented drop in public transit ridership provoked by the COVID-19 outbreak accompanied by massive revenue losses is affecting public transit agencies right across Canada putting in jeopardy their financial viability and future ability to operate;

WHEREAS the Canadian Urban Transit Association (CUTA), Canada's largest public transport lobby, the membership of which includes most Canadian transit agencies, has called for urgent emergency funding to address the immediate liquidity issues of transit operators while providing financial stability while ridership rebuilds;

WHEREAS CUTA estimates as many as 40% of systems may require bridge funding over the coming months requiring some \$1.2 billion to help them keep the buses and trains running;

WHEREAS CUTA is seeking \$400 million a month to keep services running as fare box and other revenue drop by up to 100%;

WHEREAS CUTA notes that it will likely take some time for transit operators to rebuilt ridership to February 2020 levels during a gradually return to more normal economic activity;

WHEREAS without a quick infusion of funds by the Government of Canada it is impossible to assure that the gains made over the past decade in growing the modal share of all rides taken via collective transit will not be lost;

WHEREAS while transit is a provincial jurisdiction, only the Government of Canada has the budgetary capacity to stabilize public transit during the COVID-19 emergency;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Burnaby City Council endorse CUTA's request to the Government of Canada for emergency funding to provide immediate liquidity to transit operators and on-going funding to alleviate revenue loss as ridership rebuilds;

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this motion be sent to the Prime Minister of Canada, the Minister of Transport of Canada and the Minister of Finance of Canada.
