## RE: Pedestrian struck by a hit and run vehicle at Humphries and $17^{\text {th }}$ Avenue intersection.

Your Worship and Elected Representatives;
I have lived in the Edmonds area for the past 30 years with my wife Wanda, and we have raised two daughters here. I heard the news and read the letter in the Burnaby Now letters to the editor column by Werner Meile in late December 2019.

That a 13 year old youth was struck by a hit and run driver was a shocking news story and I will not need to repeat the news or detailed and thoughtful letter already sent. I do not accept the assurance the victim will "be alright". I am concerned about the trauma and violence of that accident and the driver that fled the scene may scar this youth for life.

There are a number of streets that remain in this community without adequate streetlights or sidewalks. This particular four block section of Humphries is a well-used pedestrian route as it leads to the very popular Edmonds Community Centre and transit access along Edmonds Street. That there are several large multi-family developments along this corridor between Kingsway and Humphries is well known to Council and staff. I am writing to request that a sidewalk and lighting be added to this dark and poorly marked stretch of road. We celebrate that this young person survived. A proactive response on the part of the City of Burnaby could prevent similar incidents in the future. Thank you for your consideration of this request.
