WHEREAS Since the 1940s, St. John Ambulance has contributed to the health, safety, and quality of life of Burnaby citizens through its first aid training and through the dedication of members who selflessly volunteer thousands of hours in their community every year.

WHEREAS In 2021, St. John Ambulance is celebrating the 75th anniversary of Canada becoming a St. John Priory and the 110th anniversary for BC as a provincial St. John Council.
