The society is experiencing rapidly escalating annual liability insurance premiums that are required under the terms of occupancy in order to operate in its Confederation Park location. The 2021 renewal is projected by our insurance broker (HUB Insurance in Burnaby) to rise 20%. Insurance for 2020 was about \$30,000 and so the society is expecting this to rise accordingly. It is by far the single largest operating expense incurred by the society. In pre-pandemic years the premium could be absorbed given favourable revenues but an 80% revenue drop last year left fixed expenditures overwhelming the operating budget. This is again expected for 2021, given current health and safety concerns for the public and our members. The operating season is normally Easter to Thanksgiving (plus Halloween) but has now been cut in half and social distancing has also reduced the park capacity.

In a normal operating year the Burnaby Central Railway sells ride tokens for about 75,000 paying passengers plus thousands of under 3 year old children who ride free. The society does not track the residency of the pasengers but after 28 years of operation in the park the trains have certainly carried countless Burnaby residents. We are often informed of passengers who rode when they were young and are now back with their own children. In addition the society normally offers a birthday party package that is the most economical in the Lower Mainland and is always very popular. The society has in the past participated in the annual Hats Off Parade with an operating 1/2 scale Case steam tractor.

The pandemic has hit the Hospitality Industry very hard and the railway operates in this sphere of the economy. The society reports annually to the City of Burnaby all its financial information and has demonstrated that it historically is a very viable operating entity. This is expected to be the case in the future once everything returns to normal.

We support, advance and demonstrate model engineering by operating an outdoor recreational, miniature, passenger-carrying railway and an interpretive museum in Burnaby, British Columbia.

DESCRIPTION The society, in association with the Canadian National Railway, participates in a program to educate children about the dangers of being around full-size railway infrastructure. Local school and day-care groups are welcomed to the park to be given a presentation on railway safety by a society member, supported with an audio-visual film. Following this the groups are taken out on the railway to be given first-hand experience with a railway.				
GOAL 3 To support other non-profit organizations and charities through the provision of meeting space or a facility for outreach to the public.				
DESCRIPTION The railway station at the park has a large hall that is made available for various events. Organizations that need meeting space for their membership can book space. During the operating season, the society hosts many non-profit local small-scale railway groups. These groups assemble modular operating layouts that are on display for the public when they attend the park.
