Letters to Seniors has had a positive impact on senior and youth participants in Burnaby. Through donating their time towards creating letters or illustrations with hopeful messages for seniors, 93% of participants stated they felt more connected to seniors within the community. In addition, during a time where volunteer opportunities are limited, this program provided 438 volunteers with an opportunity that could be completed remotely to provide them volunteer hours and reference letters, with 38 residing in Burnaby. In terms of our senior participants, care-home partners were surveyed, and 83% said the program made a positive impact on the lives of their senior residents. Furthermore, 83% of care-home partners stated their seniors are feeling less socially isolated and more connected to the community through our initiative. Through our program, 927 letters were delivered to residents in Burnaby care-homes, and 38 letters were exchanged with senior pen-pals in Burnaby.

In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, staying connected with others is more important than ever. Falling under our mission to bridge and enrich generations, in the summer of 2020, we initiated a new program aiding the creation of intergenerational connections within the community in a safe and engaging manner during these times. Our new program called Letters to Seniors involves supporting isolated seniors with encouraging, meaningful handwritten letters sent by volunteers of all ages.

### Main Objectives:

- Bridge and enrich the generations by creating intergenerational connections
- Foster understanding, communication and cooperation between the generations
- Provide a supportive senior mentor to youth making a request to connect
- Increase self-esteem in youth and a sense of connectiveness

### 2 DESCRIBE THE PROJECT/EVENT/PROGRAM AND THE ACTIVITIES

Our program was created to provide support to isolated seniors in the community as well as within Burnaby care-facilities. Through the correspondence of cheerful and encouraging letters and drawings sent by youth, this initiative allows for additional intergenerational connections to be created within the Burnaby community in an engaging and safe manner. We also initiated a pen pal program where youth and seniors could correspond back and forth and further develop a meaningful connection.

All correspondence is vetted through Volunteer Grandparents' office in Burnaby, We track all the submitted letters, In order to maintain confidentiality and safety, all letters are reviewed and then forwarded along to their pen pals in a new envelope to ensure address privacy.

The support, love and guidance that our senior volunteers provide to children in Burnaby enable the children to thrive and reach for their dreams, The mentorship bonds that developed through the lottors holp strengthen the youth's self-esteem and enables them to be more resilient when dealing with adversity. The youth and seniors develop a sense of belonging which builds community. Our program is inclusive and serves a diverse population of youth and seniors. It enables seniors to actively engage in the City of Burnaby which decreases the chance of the senior experiencing social isolation and depression. We are committed to providing an inclusive and safe environment for everyone, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, age, cultural identity, or disability,

So far we have collaborated with a number of community partners in Burnaby including. Courtyard Terrace, Normanna Living, Seton Villa Retlrement Centre, Chartwell Carleton Gardens, Confederation Community Centre, Cameron Recreation Centre, Pastoral Care Ministry, Royal Arch Masonic Home, and New Vista Society. We have also had numerous Burnaby classroom teachers reach out to us to have their students participate in the program

Volunteer Grandparents values the support that we receive from the City of Burnaby. Currently: 17 seniors in Burnaby care-homes and 12 seniors living in the community were matched to pen pals. 927 Letters were shared with Seniors living in Burnaby Care Homes. Our goal is to remain to serve isolated seniors in Burnaby though this program. Number of Pen Pal Created: Create new connections.

3.Be Impactful: we survey and receive feedback from our participants to assess the strengths of our program and determine how the program can be improved. We measure how the program impacts the youth's sense of connectiveness to the community, the level of decreased sense of isolation the seniors have through participation and the level of positive impact the care-homes feel their residence have by participating in the program.

In the midst of the pandemic, one of our goals was to support isolated seniors in the community as well as seniors in residential care facilities. Since the beginning of the pandemic, volunteers have dedicated over 750 hours to the Letters to Seniors Program which has allowed us to send over 1500 letters to seniors from youth. "Making cards with my children is a wonderful family activity. It brings us a lot of joy to make them, and it is even better to know that we can brighten a senior's day. The cost of making cards is minimal but the impact is huge!" Since the Pandemic has halted recreational programs at many care facilities, receiving letters from the community has helped seniors feel less isolated during these times. "We have taken a small section of the wall in the main entrance so that when families visit, they can see that not only are their loved ones cared for by our team, but people in the community also have a positive impact on their lives." - Leader at Care Facility.
