#### 3. CORRESPONDENCE

## 3.1 <u>Memorandum from the Director of Planning and Building - Re: Heritage</u> <u>Program Updates</u>

A memorandum was received from the Director Planning and Building providing an update on the following initiatives advanced through the Community Heritage Commission (CHC):

#### Hilltop Grocery Building: 3690 Douglas Road

Staff are not advancing a recommendation to the CHC to include the above resource on the City's heritage inventory at this time, but could advance such a recommendation in the future if the owner were to express interest in submitting a heritage application.

#### Farm Tour Map

Staff continue to work on development of a farm tour map to highlight the history of agriculture in Burnaby's Big Bend. Burnaby Neighbourhood House has agreed to be a partner in the project. The partnership builds on the City and Burnaby Neighbourhood House's shared interest in food security.

#### Inkwells to Internet: A History of Burnaby Schools

Nearly all 200 copies of the original print run of Inkwells to Internet: A History of Burnaby Schools have sold. A second run of the book is currently being printed. Distribution of the book has taken place through sales at the Burnaby Village Museum.

#### 3.2 Memorandum from the City Archivist - Re: City of Burnaby Archives Update

A memorandum was received from the City Archivist providing an update on activities and initiatives at the City Archives since the 2021 April 22 meeting, and noted the following:

- Acquired 40 boxes of permanent City records between January 1 and May 31
  of this year, a significant increase from the 27 boxes of records brought in
  during the same time period last year;
- Resumed community record collecting after a year-long suspension due to COVID-19;
- Remains closed to the public for in-person access; and,
- Staff are working on planning for the Archives 20th Anniversary.

### 3.3 <u>Memorandum from the Cultural Heritage Manager - Re: Burnaby Village</u> <u>Museum Update</u>

A memorandum was received from the Cultural Heritage Manager providing an update on the following activities and initiatives at the Burnaby Village Museum since the 2021 April 22 meeting.

- Burnaby Village Museum opened for the summer season on May 1 with reservation system;
- Preparing to shift to what restart will look like at the Museum; and,
- Planning is underway for the Museum's 50th Anniversary.
- Spring Neighbourhood Speaker Series had a total live attendance of almost 400 participants and 5,000 views to date; and,
- Talks can be viewed on the Museum's Facebook page.
- June 21 National Indigenous Peoples Day
- Burnaby Village Museum currently has a vigil for the 215 indigenous children found in the unmarked grave in Kamloops.

## 4.1 Report from the Director of Planning and Building and the Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services - Re: Preservation and Repair of Cenotaphs and Heritage Landscape Features

The Director of Planning and Building and the Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services submitted a report providing an update on work underway to

preserve and maintain cenotaphs and heritage landscape features identified as civic heritage resources.

# 4.2 Report from the Director of Planning and Building - Re: Heritage Revitalization Agreement/ Heritage Designation Bylaw Captain William Eyres Residence 6079 Canada Way

The Director Planning and Building submitted a report seeking authorization to prepare a Heritage Designation Bylaw and Heritage Revitalization Agreement Bylaw for the retention of the Captain William Eyres Residence.

The Director Planning and Building recommended:

- 1. THAT the Community Heritage Commission receive this report and forward it to Council with the following recommendations:
- a. THAT Council authorize the preparation of a Heritage Revitalization Agreement Bylaw to provide for the retention and protection of the Captain Willaim Eyres Residence.

- b. THAT Council authorize the preparation of a Heritage Designation Bylaw to designate the Captain William Eyres Residence as a protected heritage site.
- c. THAT the Heritage Revitalization Agreement Bylaw and Heritage Designation Bylaw be forwarded to a public hearing at a future date.
- d. THAT Council approve the listing of the Captain William Eyres Residence on the Burnaby Community Heritage Register as a protected heritage property.
