1. CALL TO ORDER

Correspondence was received from Jeffrey Preiss, Director, Development and Communications, Crisis Intervention and Suicide Prevention Centre of British Columbia, expressing appreciation to the City for funding in support of their programs and services in Burnaby in 2021.

6. NEW APPLICATIONS - COMMUNITY GRANTS

6.1 #21.24.P - Volunteer Grandparents – Burnaby's Letters to Seniors Program REQUEST: \$3,000

An application was received from Volunteer Grandparents requesting a cash donation in support of the Burnaby's Letters to Seniors Program taking place from 2021 January 01 to December 31. The program supports isolated seniors within Burnaby care-facilities with encouraging, meaningful handwritten letters created by volunteers of all ages. Currently there are 17 seniors in care homes and 12 seniors living in the community that have been matched to pen pals. In addition, there are 38 volunteer pen-pals and the goal is to accept new youth volunteers into the program.

6.2 #21.25.P - Down Syndrome Resource Foundation - One to One Children Programs

REQUEST: \$15,000

An application was received from the Down Syndrome Resource Foundation (DSRF) in support of their One to One Children Programs taking place from 2021 September 13 to 2022 June 24. The DSRF provides specialized and innovative health and education programs that increase social connectedness and self-esteem, improve quality of life, and provide a foundation for lifelong learning. Their services are designed to empower individuals with disabilities to be more successful in public activities provided by the City in its efforts to promote inclusion. The request is higher than previous years due to the negative financial impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, which included cancellation of fundraising events.

<u>Councillor Keithley - Notice of Motion - Musical Instrument Program</u>

Councillor Keithley provided the Committee with the following notice of motion:

THAT Council authorize staff to develop a program to receive donated musical instruments from the public and then to distribute these donated instruments to people in the community who could otherwise not afford to own or rent them; and

THAT Council also authorize staff to provide, as part of the program, access to lessons that will allow participants to learn to play the instruments and to benefit from exposure to musical and artistic expression through this City initiative.

REFERRED

Councillor Keithley provided background information on the program and advised that the initial program was started with the support of Burnaby Firefighters Charitable Society. Currently the program has \$20,000 in funding to be utilized for lessons; as well as 115 musical instruments that have been donated. Councillor Keithley further advised that plans are underway for a program at Kitchener School to start in October. There have been hurdles with the school program in terms of space availability and other logistics.

The Committee expressed support for the program but also expounded the need to:

- Make sure that the program as requested is able to be implemented.
- Ensure the parameters of the program are well laid out including: management of the program; length of program; cost of program; defined criteria for in-take and distribution of instruments for the program; evaluation process of students for lessons; and, donation process for instruments and cash donations.

The Committee expressed concern with the overlap of the Recreation Credit program that is already established to support families in need; as well as the program being provided by City services as opposed to the School District. Further, the program may set a problematic precedent as the City does not provide this type of support for other sports or art programs.
