3.1 <u>Report from Director Planning and Building – Re: 2022 Lease Grants –</u> <u>Community Resource Centre</u>

A report was received from the Director Planning and Building proposing 2022 lease grants for non-profit tenants at the Holdom, Edmonds, Brentwood, Metrotown, McKercher and Pioneer Community Resource Centres.

The Director Planning and Building recommended:

- 1. THAT Council be requested to approve the proposed 2022 lease grants for community resource centre tenants, as outlined in Table 1, *attached*, of this report.
- 2. THAT Council be requested to authorize staff to make the appropriate 2022 lease renewal arrangements with Holdom, Edmonds, Brentwood, Metrotown, McKercher and Pioneer Community Resource Centre tenants.

6. NEW APPLICATIONS - COMMUNITY GRANTS

6.1 <u>#21.26.IP – Parkrun Canada</u> Parkrun Canada – Central Park Run

REQUEST: \$500 in-kind

An in-kind application was received from Parkrun Canada in support of their Central Parkrun Burnaby events taking place from 2021 September to 2022 September. The weekly free Saturday events are solely run by volunteers and held with permission from the Parks Department, in the form of a contract with an allotment fee attached. The organization took an 18-month hiatus due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, but have now received permission from the City to continue these events for the next 12 months.

History: <u>2020</u> – No Application // <u>2019</u> - \$500 in-kind fee waiver // <u>2018</u> – No Application
