SUBJECT: TRAFFIC CONCERNS AND VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS

In response to the District 4 CPAC report dated April 27, 2021, the Public Safety Committee requested information on traffic concerns in the area between Beresford and Imperial and Nelson to Patterson.

In addition, a query was received as to the status of volunteer programs, specifically Speed Watch and Cell Watch.

Response:

Two previous files have been generated, both in February, resulting from previous complaints of speeding in this area. The files were assigned to police officers and investigated. The complainant from the first file was notified of the outcome and was satisfied with the result. The second file was the result of a previous complaint from the District 4 CPAC and assigned to a traffic section officer who had followed up with all Burnaby RCMP traffic officers regarding the issue and the unit has been actively conducting enforcement in this same area when available.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic, there is no current update on when Speed Watch and Cell Watch will be resurrected. It is not likely that volunteer programs will resume prior to 2022.
