Hello Mayor and Council Members,

My name is Jordan J. Malcolm, in late May I did a delegation in regards to concerns about the impending major development by Bosa Properties at Kathleen Avenue and Kemp Street. First of all, I would like to mention that it is unethical that Bosa's Central Park House project is the only exception in the new city policy that states every major development must include social housing units. Why is Central Park House the only exception to this policy? If Bosa can redesign their tower to not include social housing, they can simply transfer the units to the now announced projects at Willingdon and Kingsway, in turn preserving Kathleen Forest. Also, Bosa calling the Kathleen Avenue project a 'green' tower is ironic because they want t clearcut a forest to do so.
