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Hello:

I would like respectfully advance a summary of our petition was being supplied in part, before 12:00pm in person, those petitions obtained from door to door canvassing, as well as those collected via an approved email method, to be supplied in ZIP file by this evening.

Of the 104 Transit-oriented-Rings identified by Bill 47, we believe each is different, and deserves bespoke application of the legislation, that take into account local differences which are key to a failed town centre and a healthy one. The Brentwood Town Centre TODA is an outlier among BC's sample set of 104 rings. in that the Town Centre leads the way in exceeding all of Burnaby's population goals and population density goals for 2050 and beyond. And therefore, the long established Brentwood Park neighbourhood, a single family lot neighbourhood currently, known locally for its decades of low crime, neighbourliness, and community wellness, can be left to contribute to the resolution of the nation's housing crisis in its own way. WE believe this community will be substantially altered with Bill 444 SSMUH alone, but can still serve as quasi parkspace (Recreational amenity) for the rest of the Brentwood Town Centre. WE would like the Municipality's Mayor and Council support in requesting an exemption of 1/4 of the Brentwood Town Centre TODA ring that has been indiscriminately superimposed over 75% of our neighbourhood.

Below is the Petition Statement

We, the friends of, and residents living in, the Brentwood Park neighbourhood, petition the City of Burnaby's Mayor and Council to recommend exempting the Brentwood Park area from an indiscriminate application of BILL 47 Transit Oriented Development Area (TODA) Ring that cuts through our neighbourhood and exposes it to its inevitable decimation through upzoning to 12 and 8 storey towers at minimum.

A total of 356 petitions were collected from April 19-April 21.

65 emails were received with multiple petitioner names

141 names were collected in person and received by Legislative Services earlier today

77 names were collected in person on non-conforming canvassing forms that omitted the Privacy Statement

A total of 356 valid and non-valid were collected beginning on April 19 to Sunday April 21.
