8. CORRESPONDENCE

8.3 <u>Taipei Economic & Cultural Office - Re: Misreference of Taiwan in Friendship City Documents</u>

Two (2) letters of correspondence were received from the Taipei Economic & Cultural Office of Vancouver (TECO) regarding the misreference of Taiwan in the City of Burnaby Friendship City documents. The letters note City documents use "Taiwan, China", which is inconsistent with the Government of Canada's policy on nomenclature concerning Taiwan. The federal government uses "Taiwan" to refer to Taiwan.

Staff advised that in recent years, the provincial and federal of governments have referred to Taiwan simply as "Taiwan". From an archival perspective, amendments to historical records cannot be made; however, staff can include

amendments to finding aids noting the City of Burnaby recognizes the modern naming convention of Taiwan.

Arising from discussion, the following motion was introduced:

THAT the City of Burnaby follow the naming protocol of the Canadian provincial and federal governments for Taiwan.

8.1 <u>Mayor of City of Cagayan de Oro - Re: Expression of Interest for Sister City</u> Relations

Correspondence was received from Mayor Rolando A. Uy of the City of Cagayan de Oro, Phillipines, expressing interest in establishing a sister city relationship with the City of Burnaby.

Arising from discussion, the following motion was introduced:

THAT staff review the expression of interest in establishing Sister and Friendship City relationships from the City of Cagayan de Oro and City of Bagio, Philippines, and report back to the Committee.

8.2 <u>Mayor of City of Mesa - Re: Invitation to City of Mesa, Arizona</u>

Correspondence was received from Mayor John Giles of Mesa, Arizona, inviting staff and council members of the City of Burnaby to Mesa, Arizona in the spring of 2024 to commemorate 25 years of the Sister City relationship between the two cities.

Sister City and Friendship City Visit in 2025

Chair Calendino noted 2025 marks the 60th anniversary of the Sister City relationship between the City of Burnaby and Kushiro, Japan, as well as the 15th anniversary of the Sister City relationship between the City of Burnaby and Hwaseong, Korea.

The Committee requested that staff look into planning a visit to Kushiro, Japan, Hwaseong, South Korean and Taichung, Taiwan in 2025.

Staff undertook to report back to the Committee.

Hwaseong Delegation Itinerary

Staff advised a delegation of 17 people from Sister City Hwaseong, South Korea, will be visiting Burnaby from January 14-15, 2024, and provided an overview of the itinerary.
