A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF EMPOWERMENT OFFICER



Reflecting on this past year, I want you to know that Mission Possible's work has never been more important.

As inflation swells, the cost of living skyrockets in Vancouver, and social assistance fails to meet people's needs, more people are seeking supportive employment opportunities than ever before. This past year over 850 people attended our information sessions, nearly double the number that we saw in previous years.

Thankfully, we were able to enroll 118 people in our Employment Readiness Program and see them start employment with us, while 39 people transitioned to employment outside of MP throughout the year. People like Immacula, who has generously shared her story in this report so you can see a glimpse of the impact your support is making in people's lives.

To each and every one of you who has given, volunteered, attended our events, employed our associates, or worked with our social enterprises: THANK YOU for your partnership!

You have encouraged people to believe in themselves and their ability to contribute meaningfully in their communities.

You have empowered people to take care of themselves and their families.

You have inspired people to step out of isolation to join a healthy community.

As we look ahead to the next year, our waitlist remains long. Hundreds more people will seek training, coaching, and employers who understand their unique barriers.

I hope to offer all of them opportunities for supportive, meaningful employment. Together we can continue to grow Mission Possible's life-changing impact through the Employment Readiness Program, and continue to invest in the beautiful, amazing people in this Downtown Eastside community.

WHAT WE DO

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH OPPORTUNITY

Mission Possible transforms lives through meaningful work. We walk alongside people facing barriers to employment by providing supportive, transitional work experience and community for those who are ready to enter the workforce.

It can be difficult to build a sustainable livelihood for people overcoming homelessness, poverty, substance use, or other barriers like physical or mental disabilities.

Through our Employment Readiness Program and two social enterprises, MP Neighbours & MP Maintenance, Mission Possible transforms lives by helping people experience a renewed sense of dignity and purpose.



Employment Readiness Program

The Employment Readiness Program supports people looking to get into the workforce. Participants receive skills training, on-the-job work experience and support with other employment-related tasks, such as creating a resume and gaining a reference.

118 people participated in the ERP



Power Breakfast & Coffee House

Every Saturday, Mission Possible hosts a weekend meal service called Power Breakfast for Downtown Eastside community members who wish to build connections to Mission Possible without yet joining the Employment Readiness Program.

MP Neighbours

MP Neighbours is a community-based solution to community safety and security. Teams complete regular neighbourhood routes in the Downtown Eastside, providing outreach and referral services to people experiencing homelessness, checking in with businesses, and building connections between these diverse groups.

IMMACULA'S STORY

FINDING FAMILY AT MISSION POSSIBLE



I walked by Mission Possible on Hastings Street many times before I went inside. Although a neighbour had told me I should check them out, I was nervous.

After nearly four years out of the workforce, one day, I finally got the courage to walk through the doors. I was up front with them about what I needed: I told them that I only want to work with women. Due to my past trauma, I was uncomfortable working alongside men.

I was happy to learn that they were open to that! In fact, Mission Possible has a whole branch of their Employment Readiness Program called the "Women's Track", designed to support women and non-binary people.

From this very first day I felt seen and heard at Mission Possible. Everything had changed for me.

I have a complicated history of substance use, mental health challenges and trauma due to an unstable upbringing and workplace issues. I know I'm not the only one, but all this makes me feel alone sometimes. Finding Mission Possible has not only helped me find community, but it has also provided the environment I needed to continue with my 15 years of sobriety.

I never imagined I'd be picking up garbage, but it humbled me and has brought me a lot of satisfaction. As a member of the Women's Track Clean Team, I worked in the Downtown Eastside with an awesome group of ladies picking up litter, needles, and more from the neighborhood.

It felt good to do something important for the community and be a part of a team.

And in addition to the part-time work, Mission Possible offered me so much more. They helped me get my resume fixed up, provided lunch and pantry items to help out at home, supported me in finding coping skills for my severe anxiety, and encouraged me to find a path back to meaningful work in the health care sector where I had worked for many years.

Six months after graduating from the Employment Readiness Program, I am taking steps to restart my career in health care. I plan to work as a Home Care Aid, providing much needed care to patients in their homes.

The people at Mission Possible are like a second family to me. Today I feel confident, cared for, and hopeful about returning to work.





Celebrating Graduates

The Women's track graduated 20 associates last year. Like Immacula, they have been equipped with skills, tools, and encouragement to return to meaningful work.

Women's Personal Development Summit

On February 7, 2023 we hosted a Women's Personal Development Summit. This is an annual event designed to empower women in the **Employment Readiness** Program and uplift them in their personal and professional growth. This year's summit consisted of four carefully curated workshops that explored topics such as goal setting, career exploration, confidence building, and well-being.

Looking Ahead

The Women's Track of our Employment Readiness Program will be relocating to a new space this year! We're thrilled to provide a separate, safe space for this program to thrive just one block east on Hastings St.

Housing Support

60 people utilized our housing support program to work towards better housing stability. We connect people with social-housing providers in the community.



Employment Readiness

90% of participants reported feeling more employable after their time in the Employment Readiness Program.



Coaching Sessions

1,019 coaching sessions took place last year. This 1:1 support helps participants navigate everything from resume writing and interview prep to citizen applications and tax returns.

852 people signed up for a program information session about our Employment Readiness Program.

Food Security

9,175 daily lunches were provided to our participants in the Employment Readiness Program through a partnership with HAVE Cafe.

INVESTING IN COMMUNITY-BASED SOLUTIONS

MP Neighbours is Mission Possible's social enterprise that provides community-based solutions to the evolving safety and security concerns in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside (DTES). This ranges from picking up used needles to offering de-escalation support, referrals to services and a helping hand to people on the street.

Most importantly, we are ambassadors for compassion, courage, and hope in our community.

The DTES is home to people of incredible resilience and diversity, while also being the epicentre of our city's struggle with the housing crisis, drug poisoning crisis, and people experiencing poverty.

Without enough safe social housing, people have created a community for themselves in the best way they know how and with the limited resources available to them.

As tensions flared over the past year between the community members, city workers, police officers, local businesses and neighbours, Mission Possible was in a unique position to offer help.

We started working with Canada Post to ensure the delivery of mail in the community, and we were awarded a contract from the City of Vancouver to staff up our MP Neighbours Team, training and hiring nearly twice as many associates as last year.

This allowed us to increase our supportive presence on the streets to help clean up, while also offering resources, food and compassion to DTES community members. At the same time, we work to build relationships with local business owners and help deepen understanding between people living and working in this neighbourhood. Our MP Neighbours associates, now known in the community as "Community Navigators", work as a team and receive training in safety and security, de-escalation, general first-aid and mental health first aid.

Your support of Mission Possible has helped to secure community-based solutions to some of our city's most complex challenges. Thank you for empowering our associates to be ambassadors for compassion, courage and hope in the Downtown Eastside.





He then joined a work crew that volunteered to renovate MP's first Headquarters on Powell Street. He served on the Board of Directors in the 2000's and saw first-hand the life-changing impact that work can have on a person who has struggled to find their place in life.


