1.0 POLICY SECTION

The provision of community grants is aligned with the following Council adopted policies, plans, and strategies: Burnaby Economic Development Strategy (2007); Social Sustainability Strategy (2011), and the Corporate Strategic Plan (2017 that identifies the importance of a sense of belonging, inclusion, and high quality of life. Community Grants are reviewed under the Community Grant Policy which came into effect January 1, 2024.

2.0 BACKGROUND

At the October 30, 2023, Council meeting, a new Community Grant Policy was approved effective January 1, 2024. The new Grant Policy allows for two intake dates for grants in 2024. The first intake was Spring of 2024, in which 52 grant applications were received. Fall 2024 is the second intake and 33 grant applications were received.

At the Open Council meeting of April 15, 2024, a recommendation from the Executive Committee of Council to provide 75% of the eligible amount to all qualifying Operating

and Initiative grants in 2024 and award returning eligible applicants the same award as 2023, was adopted.

3.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

The Fall Intake of Grant Applications contained the following eligible applications:
