Youth After School Art & Leadership Program

An application was received from Leave Out Violence (LOVE) BC requesting an initiative grant for their Youth Afterschool Art & Leadership Program scheduled to take place from October 15, 2024, to June 30, 2025. The purpose of the Youth After School Art & Leadership Program is to offer a free weekly school program for youth between 10 and 18 years old with opportunities for development, socializing and getting support from caring adults using art and diverse activities. The planned activities in 3 Burnaby schools include class presentations, workshops, guest speakers, field trips to cultural events and the opportunity to participate in community events such as Open Stages, Annual Youth Art Exhibition and Summer Camp. As a Vancouver based organization LOVE BC is only able to apply for a grant to cover their Burnaby venue rental costs. Their budget reflects venue rentals of \$3,600.
