5.1 <u>Delegation: Murray Brandt - Re</u>: Ongoing Parking Issues on Canada Way and Sperling Avenue <u>Speaker: Murray Brandt</u>

Murray Brandt provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding parking issues at Canada Way and Sperling Avenue, and highlighting the need for a long-term solution to the existing parking issues.

The General Manager Community Safety noted that the City has created a helpline where people can call to address the issues. The General Manager further noted that enforcement is currently in place for the area and the City is aware of the issue.

The Officer-In-Chief noted that the City is in contact with the educational center's leadership to address parking issues.

7.5 VERBAL REPORT - CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT

Sergeant Jamie Belleville provided a PowerPoint presentation on the catalytic converter theft in Burnaby and the Lower Mainland.

Sergeant Belleville spoke to the spike of the ICBC claims related to the catalytic converter theft and mentioned that the absence of unique identifiers on catalytic converters is a barrier to obtain evidence for convictions.

The Officer-In-Chief highlighted the recent successful investigation, where two suspects have been caught and detained.

7.6 VERBAL REPORT - INTERVENTION SUPPORT

Justin Sekiguchi, Manager Intervention Support, provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding Intervention Support Department activities.

The Manager further spoke regarding the updated intervention procedures, and how the proactive approach helps decrease the cases of unsheltered individuals. The speaker provided statistics of homelessness increase within the last four years.

In conclusion, the Manager Intervention Support shared success stories of unsheltered individuals, who have been assisted to transitional and permanent housing.
