#### 5. <u>DELEGATIONS AND INVITED PRESENTATIONS</u>

5.1 Delegation: Youth Climate Corps BC - Re: Work with Youth Climate Corps BC

Speaker: Samantha Kutyauripo

Samantha Kutyauripo, Youth Climate Corps BC (YCCBC), appeared before Council to address the urgent need for meaningful youth engagement in the workforce, particularly in climate-resilient careers. The speaker provided a PowerPoint presentation noting that YCCBC has completed 10,000 working days of community climate action and training, hiring around 100 youth for 4-6 months, paying them a living wage and conducting projects that enhance local resilience and contribute to global mitigation efforts. The speaker requested that Council assist in exploring opportunities to collaborate with Burnaby staff to develop programming that aligns with the City's climate goals and supports meaningful, youth-driven climate action in the community.

Arising from discussion, Council introduced the following motion:
