### INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND FRIENDSHIP CITIES COMMITTEE

**TO:** MAYOR AND COUNCILLORS

SUBJECT: 2025 OFFICIAL SISTER AND FRIENDSHIP CITIES VISIT TO JAPAN, SOUTH KOREA, AND TAIWAN

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

**THAT** a delegation of Council be authorized to visit Kushiro, Japan, Hwaseong, South Korea, and Taichung, Taiwan; and

**THAT** representatives from the Burnaby business community, Tourism Burnaby, Burnaby Board of Trade, Burnaby Board of Education, Simon Fraser University, and British Columbia Institute of Technology be invited to participate in the Official Sister Cities and Friendship City visit.

### REPORT

The International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee, at its meeting held on July 23, 2024, received and adopted the <u>attached</u> report seeking approval for a delegation of Council to visit Sister Cities Kushiro, Japan and Hwaseong, South Korea, and Friendship City Taichung, Taiwan.

The report has not appeared on Council agenda immediately after the July 23, 2024, International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee meeting due to Standing Committee appointments, Acting Mayor schedule, and budget considerations.

At its meeting held on November 18, 2024, the International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee received correspondence from the City of Kushiro, Japan, informing the Committee of the preferable dates for delegation of the City of Burnaby to visit the City of Kushiro. The Committee agreed that there is a need to amend the report to reflect the updated travel dates and delegation destinations.

Based on correspondence received from the City of Kushiro, the Committee agreed to change the delegation travel dates from March 2025 to September 2025 to accommodate visiting the City of Kushiro during the "Kushiro Tairyo Donpaku" event, which will take place on September 13 and 14, 2025.

The Committee further inquired about the cost breakdown per delegate to visit Japan only, Japan and Korea, and Japan, Korea and Taiwan, to assess delegation destinations.

The estimated cost per delegate is summarized in the table below:

JAPAN, SOUTH KOREA, AND TAIWAN

**PURPOSE:** To seek approval for a delegation of Council to visit Sister Cities

Kushiro, Japan and Hwaseong, South Korea, and Friendship City

Taichung, Taiwan.

### RECOMMENDATION

**THAT** a delegation of Council be authorized to visit Kushiro, Japan, Hwaseong, South Korea, and Taichung, Taiwan;

**THAT** representatives from the Burnaby business community, Tourism Burnaby, Burnaby Board of Trade, Burnaby Board of Education, Simon Fraser University, and British Columbia Institute of Technology be invited to participate in the Official Sister Cities and Friendship City visit.

### 1.0 POLICY SECTION

The City of Burnaby maintains Sister and Friendship City relationships that meet the goals and objectives of Burnaby's International Relations and Friendship Cities Program.

Sister City and Friendship City visits support the following City policies: Climate Action Framework; Official Community Plan; Community Safety Plan; Transportation Plan; Economic Development Strategy; Environmental Sustainability Strategy; Housing and Homelessness Strategy; and Social Sustainability Strategy.

### 2.0 BACKGROUND

Burnaby has a strong tradition of international sister and friendship city relationships. Sister and friendship cities have intrinsic long-term benefits for the community, like spreading economic and cultural awareness.

### 2.1 Kushiro, Japan

The Sister City relationship between Kushiro, Japan and Burnaby began in 1965.

### 2.2 Hwaseong, South Korea

The Sister City relationship between Hwaseong, South Korea and Burnaby began in 2010.

### 2.3 Taichung, Taiwan

The Hi-Tech City Declaration between Taichung, Taiwan and Burnaby was signed in 2007 and the Friendship City relationship between the two cities began in 2009.

### 3.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

2025 marks the sixtieth anniversary of the Sister City relationship between the City of Burnaby and Kushiro, Japan, the fifteenth anniversary of the Sister City relationship between the City of Burnaby and Hwaseong, Korea, and the sixteenth anniversary of the Hi-Tech City Declaration between Taichung, Taiwan, and Burnaby.

At its meeting on January 11, 2024, the International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee requested that staff investigate planning a visit to Kushiro, Japan, Hwaseong, South Korea, and Taichung, Taiwan in 2025.

### 4.0 COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Not applicable.

### **5.0 FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

It is at Council's discretion on the dates to travel to Asia. There has been an invitation for Council to attend the Taipei/ Kaohsiung Smart City Summit & Expo, which for 2025 takes place from March 18 to 22. As a result, the Committee may recommend that Council send a delegation to Asia in March 2025.

The estimated cost per delegate is summarized in the table below for 15 days:

International Relations activities have previously been budgeted from the Gaming Reserve. Should Council authorize the delegation, the budget required would be included as a commitment against the Gaming Reserve during the 2025-2029 Financial Planning process. Approval is required in advance of the 2025-2029 Financial Plan Bylaw, which will be presented to Council early in 2025, so that staff are able to start planning the trip and make necessary travel arrangements.

WHEREAS

the City of Burnaby, Province of British Columbia, Canada and Hwaseong City, Gyeonggi Do Province, Republic of Korea signed a Letter of Intent on July 24, 2008 as well as a Memorandum of Understanding on March 24, 2010 agreeing to develop friendly relations between the two cities; and

**WHEREAS** 

since 2008, both cities have had the opportunity to work towards fostering respect, mutual understanding, and meaningful connections between each other through the exchange of ideas and valuable information; and

**WHEREAS** 

these discussions have resulted in the City of Burnaby and Hwaseong City agreeing to become Sister Cities for the purposes of:

- · establishing projects, international exchanges and joint learning opportunities in the areas of economic development, education, sports and cultural awareness
- promoting peace through mutual respect and understanding and building lasting friendships between our people.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT**, on this historic occasion being the 28<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2010 and in the spirit of friendship and cooperation, the City of Burnaby and Hwaseong City respectfully enter into an official Friendship City relationship; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** two copies of this official Friendship City Agreement be presented in both the Korean and English Language and signed by representatives of the City of Burnaby and Hwaseong City.

and Taichung City, Taiwan, R.O.C. signed a Hi-Tech Cities Declaration on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2007 acknowledging the value in supporting hi-tech

Derek Corrigan and Officials from the City of Burnaby are visiting Taichung City for the purpose of further pursuing business relations between the two cities and to establish a

friendship declaration; and

WHEREAS a friendship declaration between the City of

Burnaby and Taichung City will promote communication and sharing of information on matters of mutual benefit such as arts and culture, tourism, education, industry and

economy, and the environment; and

WHEREAS to sustain the success of the friendship

declaration, the City of Burnaby and Taichung City will encourage visits between the citizens of both cities including government officials, manufacturing and business leaders, education officials, and other interested

organizations and individuals; and

WHEREAS the friendship declaration shall have four

official copies; two (2) in the English language

and two (2) in the Mandarin language.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of

Burnaby, British Columbia, Canada and Taichung City, Taiwan, R.O.C. enter into a declaration of friendship for the purpose of strengthening ties between the two cities and to promote ongoing dialogue on matters of

mutual interest and benefit.
