səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh), and kwikwəxəm (Kwikwetlem) Peoples. Each Nation has distinct histories and distinct traditional territories that fully or partially encompass the city. We encourage you to learn more about the Host Nations whose ancestors have occupied and used these lands, including parts of present-day Burnaby, for thousands of years.

# 5. INFORMATION REPORTS

# 5.1 COMBINED SEWER SEPARATION AND I&I MANAGEMENT

The General Manager Engineering introduced Ron Weismiller, Sr. Operations Engineer Waste & Water, and provided a PowerPoint presentation outlining sewer separation systems and practices.

The speaker advised that the City of Burnaby is committed to providing reliable sewer collection services at minimal cost

In conclusion, the speaker noted that the combined sewer separation requires intensive effort to create both separate sanitary and rainwater systems. I&I reduction can be achieved through system rehabilitation, repair or replacement. The speaker further noted that I&I (inflow and infiltration) increases with pipe age and the effects of climate change. Combined sewer separation and I&I management should be included as a part of an overall Asset Management planning process and feed, into the development of operating and capital projects.

# 5.2 PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURE LONG-RANGE PLAN INITIATION

The General Manager Parks, Recreation and Culture submitted a report informing Council of the Parks, Recreation and Culture Long-Range Plan project scope, process, and timeline.

The General Manager Parks, Recreation and Culture introduced Andre Isakov, Director PRC Planning, and John Musil, Manager PRC Policy Planning, who provided a PowerPoint presentation summarizing the report.

At the conclusion of the presentation, the Committee noted the importance of ensuring connection with each of the communities and extending the outreach of community engagement to ensure that ethnic communities are included by diversifying the methods of communication.

The Committee also noted the importance of utilizing established parks by expanding the usage in various ways. Examples given were Deer Lake Beach being expanded to encourage seasonal usage, and Burnaby Village Museum open spaces being used for an artist's village.

The Committee expressed a vision for parks, recreation and culture programming space where people from various cultural communities feel included. Initiatives should reflect cultural heritage spaces in both programming and public spaces.

The Committee further noted the importance of ensuring the inclusion of all age groups such as youth and seniors in the public engagement.

The General Manager Parks, Recreation and Culture expressed appreciation to Andrew McQuire, a local Burnaby artist, who provided the artwork for the Power Point presentation.
