Subject: Whey-ah-Wichen Canoe Festival, July 4-6, 2025, North Vancouver, BC

Dear friends and partners of the Tsleil-Waututh Nation,

It is my pleasure to send greetings from the beautiful waters of the səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh Nation), home of our canoe families who have paddled in Burrard Inlet since time immemorial. We are excited to see signs of spring across our territory, it also marks the beginning of planning for our annual Canoe Festival. For səlilwətał and participating nations, our canoe races are one of the most important events we host annually. The races provide an opportunity for knowledge transfer in the community and amongst our canoe families; we share our canoe culture while honouring the past, celebrating the present, and imagining the future of our people. It is in the spirit of canoe culture that we are reaching out to you today.

The generosity of our supporters in 2024 contributed to a fantastic event that was attended by hundreds of spectators, and it was featured on the local news and across social media. We hosted 250 paddlers from 17 canoe clubs located across the Lower Mainland, Vancouver Island, and Washington State who competed in a total of 49 races; 17 of these races were for adults, six races were for paddlers aged 50+, and 26 races were for the children and youth. It is important that our young ones participate in the practice of our culture and traditions.

From July 4-6, 2025, we are hosting our festival at Whey-ah-Wichen/Cates Park, our traditional village site in North Vancouver, the event celebrates our culture, showcases athleticism, inspires youth, and thrills hundreds of spectators. We would welcome your support for the ongoing success of this annual event and are seeking sponsorships in the form of cash donations, volunteers, raffle prizes, silent auction items or other contributions.


