THAT staff be directed to approve the Sport Hosting Grant recipients unless there are more qualified applicants than funds available to be awarded, in which case staff will bring forward a report to the Executive Committee with a summary of the vetted tournament applications and recommendations for funding to be forwarded to Council for approval.

1.0 POLICY SECTION

The Sport Hosting Grant Program aligns with the goals and values in the Corporate Strategic Plan (2017), Social Sustainability Strategy (2011), Burnaby Economic Strategy (2017), Healthy Community Policy (1991), and the Benefits Based Approach (2023).

2.0 BACKGROUND

The Sport Hosting Grant Program outlined in the report to the Executive Committee of Council titled "Sport Hosting Grant Program Revisions" was approved April 3, 2024. Staff completed a pilot intake of the Sport Hosting Grant in the Fall of 2024 and then undertook process refinements to align the intake timeline with PRC Allotment timelines and finalize an online application form and guide for easy and efficient submission of applications by groups.

5.0 FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Currently, funding for Sport Hosting Grants is provided from the PRC Operating Budget with a maximum of \$75,000 set aside annually. Approval of the two recommended grant recipients would reduce the funds available for the remainder of 2025 to \$65,000.
